 **Weekly Update on Becoming a Sanctuary Church:** As CT organizations that fight for freedom for immigrants raise their voices, we are being called on to join in the effort to Free Our Future and Abolish ICE. In recent weeks, the separation of child migrants from their parents has inspired justifiable outrage from all people of conscience. However, it is not enough to demand to keep families together. That allows for the indefinite detention of families in cages and internment camps. To stop child separation, we must stop criminalizing and sending their parents to prison.

**Food Donations for Needy:** First Pres collects food year-round since there are hungry people year-round. Pick up an extra item at the grocery store to help fill the green wheelbarrow in the Copeland Room. At the end of each month the food is delivered to Christian Community Action's emergency food pantry.

**Fresh Produce for Christian Community Action:** In addition, to our non-perishable food donations in the wheelbarrow for CCA, this summer we are asking one volunteer each week to purchase up to \$40 in fresh produce at a local farmers' market or stand and deliver it to CCA as early in the week as possible. Suggestions include collards, Swiss chard, bok choy (and other greens), broccoli, cauliflower, carrots, tomatoes, apples etc., but choose whatever looks best to you. Deliver the produce to CCA at 168 Davenport Ave., New Haven, anytime Monday through Thursday between 9:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Delivering it the same day it is purchased is best if that is possible.
